

# NOTICE OF RACE 2016 CHILOE ISLANDS RACE CASTRO – PUERTO MONT

2015 – 2016 National Oceanic Championship

**ORGANIZING AUTHORITY:** Club Náutico Oceánico de Chile **SPONSORS:** Armada de Chile.

### 1. RULES

The championship will be governed by:

- a) The rules as defined by the RRV of ISAF.2013-2016
- b) Security Standards DGTM (Ordinary N°12.400 / 81VRS)
- c) The General Racing Rules of CNO Season 2015-2016
- d) The regatta will be Category 3 C.N.O.
- e) Special Regulations classes: National IRC, Soto 40, J / 105, J / 24 and Melges 24.
- f) Is added to RRV41: (e) Assistance to recover a crewman aboard water and return it if such return is in the approximate position of recovery.
- g) The Q Addendum will be apply to the Soto 40 Class with the following modification: In the event that a yacht from any class fleet had an incident with a Soto 40 class boat, the Q Addendum will be apply between them. This changes RRV63.1.

### 2. ADVERTISING

Advertising can be displayed according to the rules and the ISAF 20 regulation Class, Advertising Code.

Also, due to advertising agreements of the organization that made this event possible, the organization strongly request captains cooperation of all requests to display advertising on their boats in other parts of the boat that are not included in regulation 20.

# 3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

The event is open to all boats of the following classes:

- a) IRC 1-2
- b) **IRC 3**
- c) IRC 4
- d) **SOTO 40**
- e) J/105
- f) J/24 (with genova, 5 crew)
- g) MELGES 24
- h) **CLÁSICOS**

## NOTE:

- Each boat must present their certificate of monotype or IRC accordingly.
- Boats without ratting certificate will be classified at the discretion of the Organizer.
- A minimum of 4 homologates boats are required to form a class.

## NOTE:

- For IRC 3 Soto 40 and J / 105 class may be courses race at the following locations:
  - Queilén.
  - · Achao.
  - Quemchi.
  - Cabuco.
  - Puerto Montt.
- For the IRC 3, J/105, J/24 and Melges 24 class are scheduled 10 races, 6 and 4 cruise travel.
- For Soto 40 class are scheduled 12 races, 6 cruise and 6 windward leeward.
- For classes IRC 1-2,4 and Classic 8 races are scheduled.
- The travel race can be windward leeward or trips within the respective bays. This will be defined in the Sailing Instructions.
- The dates of this program will remain unchanged, however, schedules are subject to change at the discretion of the organization.

#### 5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be delivered during the Captains Meeting on Friday January 22, 2016 will be held at 19:00 am at the Marine Village Castro. However, these may be available early in the page www.cno.cl

#### 6. PLACE

The race office will be in the ship that the Chilean Navy provided for this purposes.

## 7. PENALTY SYSTEM

In case of violation of the rules of Part 2 or Rule 31 of the RRS, the penalty rule 44.1 and 44.2 of the RRS, consisting of one turn, including one tack and one jibe apply. Amends RRS 44.1.

## **8. SCORING AND DESCARTES**

Low scoring system (RRS Appendix A4) is used.

The Championship will be valid with 5 races completed.

#### 9. ANCHOR

Boats should in places that are designated mooring areas by the organization.

#### 10. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Competing boats must be in the water from 21:00 pm on Friday January 22 until the end of the last scheduled race.

They may not be hauled out during the regatta except with the prior approval of the Race Committee.

#### 11. USE OF DIVING EQUIPMENT

Except for the Soto 40 Class the use of masks and diving equipment during the race is not allowed, from 21:00 hrs. Day January 22 until after completion of the last race of the championship.

#### 12. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.



### **13. GUESTS**

The Ocean Club Nautico de Chile reserves the right to pick up guests from the sponsors of the regatta aboard boats competing in the races to be defined in the Captains Meeting.

#### 14. RISK STATEMENT

Competitors and support teams participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk and they are reminded of the provisions of RRS 4, Decision to Race. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor and support team member agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and the boat supplied to them to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their supplied boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) By participating in any race, they are satisfied that their supplied boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
